


She is project director of Humanities Commons, an open-access, open-source network serving more than 30,000 scholars and practitioners across the humanities and around the world, and she is author of *Generous Thinking: A Radical Approach to Saving the University* (Johns Hopkins University Press, 2019), *Planned Obsolescence: Publishing, Technology, and the Future of the Academy* (NYU Press, 2011), and *The Anxiety of Obsolescence: The American Novel in the Age of Television* (Vanderbilt University Press, 2006). She is president of the board of directors of the [Educupia Institute](#), and she served as president of the [Association for Computers and the Humanities](#) from 2020 to 2022.
